#### **Executive Summary**

For the past two decades, since 2002, the Center for School Change (CSC) has compiled and analyzed demographic data from the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) regarding K-12 public school enrollment in the state's district and chartered public schools. This endeavor aims to contribute to informed public discourse. All population counts are derived from October enrollment data reported to MDE, accessible through the <a href="Data Center">Data Center</a>. We extend our gratitude to MDE staff and the Minnesota Association of Charter Schools for their invaluable assistance.

The CSC does not assert that district public schools or chartered public schools are inherently 'better' overall. In our testimony, reports, and newspaper columns, we advocate for educators, families, and policymakers to utilize multiple measures when assessing school effectiveness. Furthermore, we advocate for the broader adoption of the faculty, programs, and policies of the most effective public schools in Minnesota, irrespective of governance.

This report specifically focuses on K-12 enrollment patterns and demographics, excluding Pre-Kindergarten or Early Childhood Education enrollment. As the information in this report reveals, charter enrollments and demographics exhibit considerable variation. It would be a mistake to generalize about individual Minnesota chartered public-school K-12 enrollment. Additionally, since 2019, the Minnesota Department of Education no longer provides exact counts or percentages for schools serving over 90% of low-income students, English Language Learners, and students with disabilities. Unfortunately, this results in an undercount of these student groups in this report, marked with an asterisk.

Importantly, this report does <u>not</u> address school effectiveness; instead, it highlights several trends observed over the last 21 school years:

#### Statewide Data:

- Statewide, K-12 enrollment in public schools, including district and charter sectors, increased slightly from 841,697 (2001-02) to 846,192 (2022-23).
- Statewide, Minnesota K-12 charter enrollment has increased by over 600% from 10,162 in 2001-2002 to 67,227 in 2022-2023.
- During the same 2001-2022 to 2022-2023 period, statewide traditional district public school K-12 enrollment declined from 831,535 to 778,965 (a decrease of 6.74%).
- Statewide, and in Minneapolis charters enroll a higher percentage of students from low-income families, students of color, and English Language Learners. In St Paul, charters enroll a higher percentage of students of color and English Language Learners, and within one percent of the percentage of BIPOC students (69.97% in charters, 70.97% in St Paul District).
- The enrollment of students with disabilities in traditional districts is 16.18% and, in chartered schools, 14.98%, a difference of 1.20%.
- Enrollment in chartered public schools has increased from 1% to 7.94% of total K-12 Minnesota public school enrollment.
- K-12 Charter enrollment has grown in Minneapolis and St Paul over the last decade. K-12 enrollment in both urban districts has declined over the last decade.

- Minneapolis public charter school enrollment 1,921 (2001-2002) to 15,100 (2022-2023).
- Minneapolis Public School's enrollment 47,658 (2001-2002) to 28,297 (2022-2023).
- St. Paul public charter school enrollment 3,598 (2001-2002) to 16,701 (2022-2023).
- St. Paul Public Schools enrollment 43,714 (2001-2002) 31,124 (2022-2023).

Over the last twenty years, there has been a decline of thousands of students from low-income families and students of color enrolled In Minneapolis and St. Paul and an increase of thousands of these students in the charter public school sector.

- 1. In Minneapolis, comparing the 2001-2002 and 2022-2023 school years:
  - As of 2022-23, charters in Minneapolis enrolled, on average, a substantially higher percentage
    of BIPOC students, students from low-income families, and students whose native language is
    not English. Minneapolis Public School District enrolled, on average, a slightly higher percentage
    of students with special needs.
  - K-12 enrollment in Minneapolis charters increased from 1,921 to 15,100.
  - K-12 district enrollment in Minneapolis declined from 47,658 to 28,297.
  - Enrollment of students from low-income families in Minneapolis decreased from 31,910 to 16,113.
  - Enrollment of students from low-income families in the Minneapolis charter sector increased from 1,579 to 11,139.
  - Enrollment of BIPOC students in Minneapolis traditional districts decreased from 35,054 to 17,464.
  - Enrollment of BIPOC students in the charters located in Minneapolis increased from 1,726 to 11,113.
- 2. In Saint Paul, comparing the 2001-2002 and 2022-2023 school years:
  - As of 2022-23, charters in Saint Paul enrolled, on average, a slightly higher percentage of students from low-income families, and students whose native language is not English. SPPS enrolled, on average, a slightly higher percentage of students with special needs and BIPOC students.
  - K-12 enrollment in charters located in Saint Paul increased from 3,598 to 16,701.
  - K-12 enrollment in Saint Paul traditional schools decreased from 43,714 to 31,124.
  - K-12 enrollment in Saint Paul charters of students from low-income families increased from 2,683 to 11,686.
  - K-12 enrollment in Saint Paul traditional school of students from low-income families decreased from 28,524 to 22,090.
  - K-12 BIPOC enrollment in charters located in Saint Paul increased from 2,993 to 13,501.
  - K-12 BIPOC enrollment in Saint Paul traditional schools decreased from 30,102 to 24,329.

In conclusion, this comprehensive analysis of K-12 enrollment data in Minnesota's public schools reveals dynamic shifts in the educational landscape over the past two decades. The transformative surge of 600% in K-12 charter enrollment stands out against the backdrop of modest statewide enrollment growth and declining traditional district public school enrollment.

Charter schools, particularly in Minneapolis and St. Paul, play a crucial role in serving a diverse student demographic, often enrolling higher percentages of students from low-income families, students of color, and English Language Learners compared to traditional districts. Additionally, the observed differences in enrollment of students with disabilities between traditional districts and charter schools highlight the nuanced landscape. As chartered public-school enrollment has reached nearly 8% of the total K-12 public school population, it underscores the growing impact and choice these schools provide to students and families. This emphasizes the pivotal role of charter schools in addressing the needs of diverse student populations and contributing to the evolving landscape of educational choices within the state.
